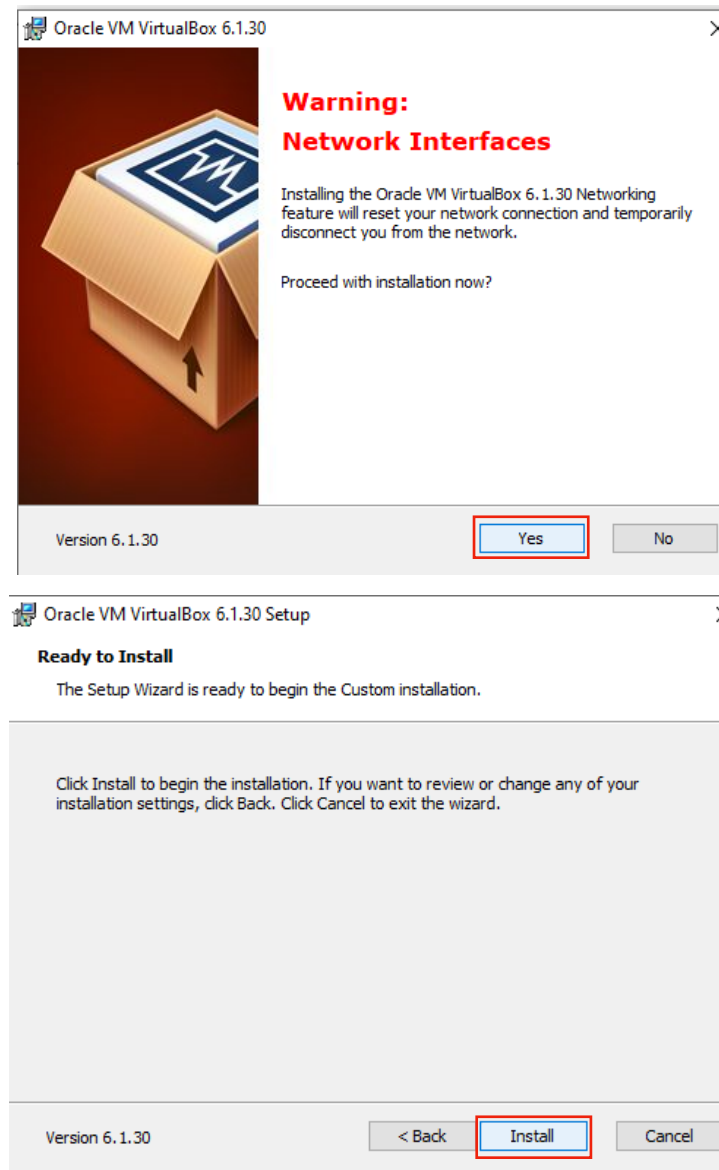
Locate the installer in the Downloads folder and double click on it to launch it.



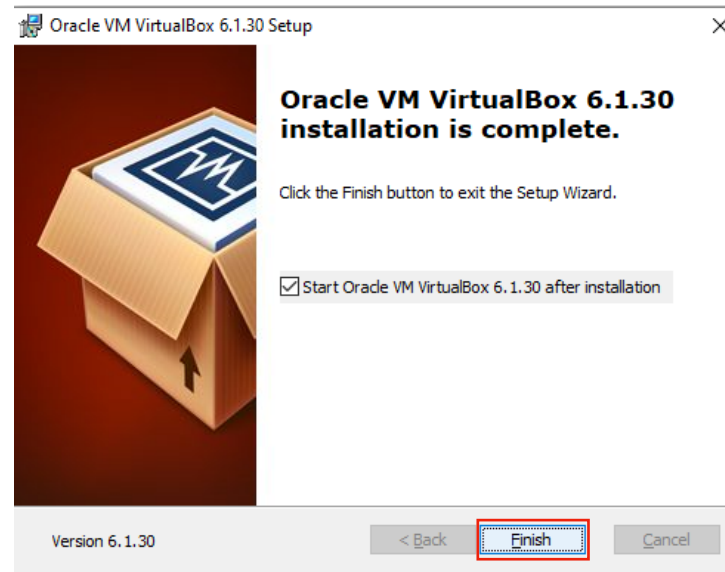
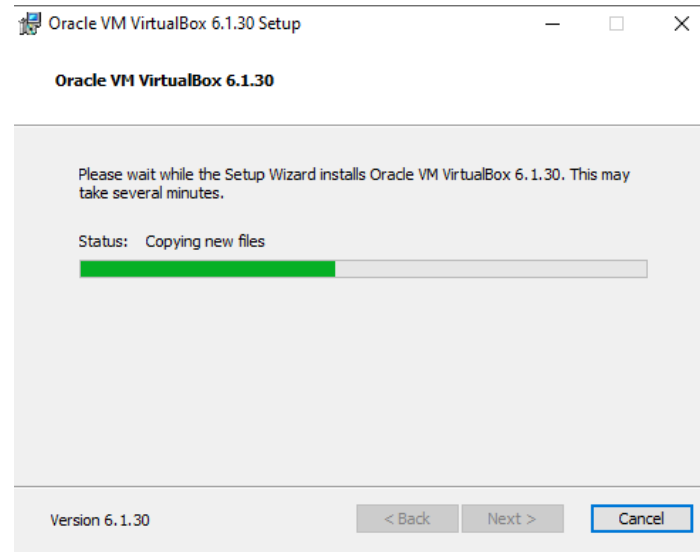
Choose to install the default setup/configuration with the default options.
